GHPD seeking suspects in Steak & Shake robbery

Garfield Heights police are still searching for four male suspects in an armed robbery at Steak and Shake on Vista Way in City View early Monday morning. All the males were armed with handguns.

A Garfield Heights police report states a male and female employee were sitting in a booth at the back of the restaurant on November 26th, around 2 a.m., when the four men came in. The employees said one of them came up to their booth, pointed a gun at the woman, and stole a watch from the man before telling him to lay down on the bench. The suspect then grabbed the woman by the throat and told her to open the registers, but she was too shaken and couldn't get them open, according to the report.

A second male reportedly grabbed another female employee by her collar and forced her into an office where a safe was located. She was also unsuccessful in opening the safe.

The third and fourth male suspects grabbed another employee, shoved him to the ground and pistol whipped him before forcing him to open the cash registers near the drive-thru window, according to the report.

The other two suspects were able to grab the drawers from other registers. As all four of them fled towards the exit, one of the males pointed his gun towards the employees and then the grills and fired one round which ricocheted off one of the grills. The suspects left and one of the employees then locked the door and called police.

The employees said the males were dressed in hooded sweatshirts and had bandanas covering their faces. It is unknown whether the males fled on foot or got into a nearby vehicle. The store manager arrived and was able to access the video.

The Shaker Heights PD K9 Unit and Valley View PD arrived to help locate the suspects with negative results. The employee that had been pistol whipped had minor abrasions on his arm and was taken to Marymount Hospital for treatment. Police continue to investigate.

Foote's Valley Farm in V.V. closes after 62 years

That sweet corn is gone but will never be forgotten.

Foote's Valley Farm on Canal Road in Valley View closed its doors on November 17th after 62 years in business. A retirement party for owners Sue and Earl Foote was held last Saturday at Foote's market to say farewells. The Footes had this to say about their time at the farm.

"Well, this farm guy and non-farm gal married in 1956," said Sue. Her first tractor driving left something to be desired but "things did improve!"

"I was the farmer, but Sue made it a business. I owe it all to her," said Earl.

"Our first sales were of fresh picked sweet corn on a wagon out front. From there, things progressed from a small building, expansions, added porches, greenhouses and a new building after the flood of 2006," Sue said.

She said that flood left seven feet of water in the market and over two feet of water in their home, an old school house located on the Foote's Valley Farm property. Sue and Earl then built the ground up 11 feet and constructed the "new" market.

"Our family, David, Richard, William, Michele and Robert, were all an integral part of the business - on the farm, in the greenhouse and in the market. They always helped when needed," said Sue, but none of them wanted to take over the business.

The Footes don't have any immediate retirement plans, wanting to stay in their home for now.

Some memories Sue shared from her time on the farm included picking 1000 dozen ears of corn in one day, 900 pies being baked for one Thanksgiving, a microburst that threw broken greenhouse glass all over, a car running into the stand and hitting the checkout counter, cleaning out mud - over and over again - after numerous floods, the fun of planting and growing in the greenhouse ("Robert did precise research to ensure good varieties such as 'Red Deuce' tomatoes that we carried in the market this year,") and the eight-slice bacon BLTs when Richard ran a deli at the farm.

Neighborhood News owner Mike Psenicka said the Footes are a wonderful couple and will be missed by the hundreds of people who know and love them, and their corn!

"It won't be summer anymore without a trip each week down Warner Road hill and over to Foote's for that fabulous corn," said Psenicka.

Valley View Mayor Jerry Piasecki honored the Footes with a proclamation making November 24th officially "Foote Valley Farm Day" in the village.

The proclamation reads in part: "The Foote Family signifies the best of American values and always lives by those values."

Sue and Earl said they will never forget their great employees and customers and the much-loved friends they have made over the past 62 years.

But it's time for that farm guy and non-farm gal to enjoy some well-deserved down time from life on the farm and make more happy memories along the way.

Service Director Tim McLaughlin reported that leaf pickup in the city will go on as long as possible. He also said 874 warnings for trash violators have gone out, with 67 residents getting first tickets, 16 getting two tickets, three with third tickets and one with a fourth.

Economic Development Director Noreen Kuban requested residents with ideas on how to spend Community Block Grant funding to contact Pat Salemi, 216-475-1100.

Building Commissioner Mark Moro urged safety when residents set up holiday lighting and stressed to only use heavy-duty outdoor extension cords.

The following legislation was passed at Monday night's council meeting, all by emergency ordinances:

- Authorizing application for a Community Development Supplemental Grant (CDSG) and entering into an agreement with the Cuyahoga County Department of Development to initiate a citywide safety and security program.

The city is eligible to receive up to \$50,000 from the CDSG program, which is funded by the county's Casino Tax revenue funds. If granted the funding, Garfield Heights will, according to the legislation, purchase security cameras to be installed in various public locations, as well as LED Dusk-to-Dawn sensor light bulbs to distribute to property owners.

The city would also develop an awareness campaign to encourage participation in the Safety and Security Program and promote the need for neighbors to work together on crime prevention efforts.

- Authorizing application for a Workers' Compensation Safety Intervention Grant to purchase a portable lift for the Garfield Heights Service Garage. The lift cost would be no more than \$16,000, with the city responsible for 25 percent of its cost, or \$4,000.

- Establishing the Municipal Court Special Project Building Fund within the city's budgetary fund structure as a vehicle to collect all fees designated to build a new courthouse/police department.

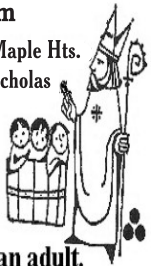

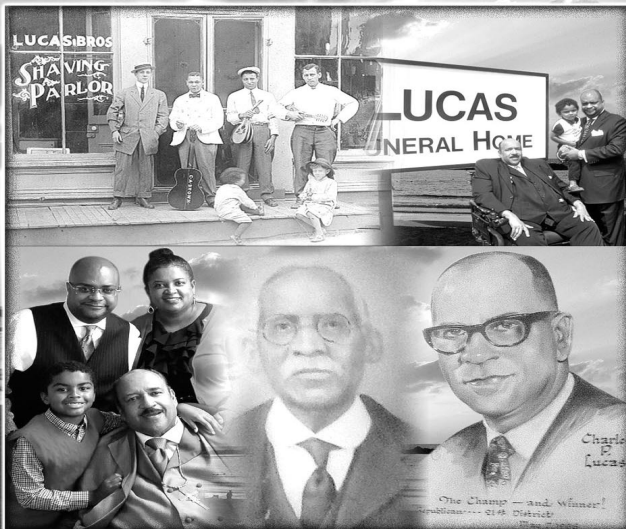

NHS Executive Director arrested

Michael Cosgrove, 43, executive director of Neighborhood Housing Services of Greater Cleveland headquartered in the North Broadway neighborhood of Slavic Village, has been charged with attempted unlawful sexual contact with a minor, importuning and possessing criminal tools, according to the Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office.

Cosgrove allegedly began chatting on a popular social media platform with someone he believed to be a 15-year-old female, according to the prosecutor's office, but was actually an undercover Internet Crimes Against Children officer (ICAC).

On Monday, Nov. 26, he allegedly travelled to an undisclosed area in Parma Heights to engage in sexual activity with the child. Upon his arrival, Cosgrove was apprehended by law enforcement officers with the Ohio ICAC, according to prosecutors. The ICAC team was assisted by Parma Heights Police and

Cosgrove was taken into custody without incident.

Cosgrove is also the former Cleveland Community Development director.

Cuyahoga County Court records say his first appearance, set for today, was cancelled because his attorney suggested the case be sent to the grand jury.

MHHS wrestling season dedicated to Milkovich, Sr.

Maple Heights City Schools Superintendent Charles Keenan and Athletic Director Nick Kaliszewski have announced that the 2018-19 Maple Heights High School wrestling season will be dedicated to Mike Milkovich, Sr.

The legendary coach guided the Mustangs to 10 state titles and 8 runner-up finishes from 1951 to his retirement in 1977. The dedication will culminate with a dual match versus Garfield Heights on Saturday, Feb. 16, in Maple's Wylie Athletic Complex at

2 p.m. Fans from both schools are requested to wear bright red shirts in recognition of Milkovich's remarkable career. A reception will follow.

As a high school wrestler himself, Milkovich won the 145-pound state championship for Garfield Heights High during his senior year in 1941.

Jamie Milkovich, nephew of Milkovich, Sr., enters his 38th season as head coach of his alma mater and will once again be assisted by longtime cohort Rick LaScala and Andrew Wolf.

Bedford nationally recognized for its holiday display as city readies for 'Bedford Falls' event

The city of Bedford has received national recognition in time for the holiday season as Reader's Digest, Country Living magazine and MSN.com have declared the community as having one of the most beautiful Christmas displays in the entire United States, officials announced at the council meeting last week.

The honor comes as the city is getting ready for its annual "Christmas in Bedford Falls" celebration, to be held on Bedford Public Square on Saturday, Dec. 8, from 12 noon to 4 p.m.

Every year the city of Bedford is transformed into a replica of its "sister," the legendary fictional town of Bedford Falls, featured in the perennial Jimmy Stewart holiday favorite "It's A Wonderful Life.

An article, "12 Old-Fashioned Christmas Towns You Should Visit" by Jill Glesson and Lori Vanover, was recently published in Country Magazine and republished in Reader's Digest and also featured on the MSN.com website.

"Christmas in Bedford Falls" is presented by the Southeast Region Chamber of Commerce. The celebration will feature free rides on Lolly the Trolley, visits with Santa and Mrs. Claus, hot chocolate and S'mores, a puppet show, visit from Balloon Bender, the Children's Craft Tent, open houses at The Purr-fect Place (Valley

Save-A-Pet), and the Bedford Museum, and tours of the Dunham House.

At last week's meeting, City Manager Mike Mallis stated, "This is a great event, and it's a lot of effort and hard work by a lot of individuals."

Seeking grant funding

Working towards the goal of continuing to improve the appearance of the city, including attractive and consistent signage throughout town, council approved an ordinance authorizing Mallis to apply for a total of \$200,000 in grant funding from Cuyahoga County.

The legislation states that the city wants to apply for a \$50,000 Community Development Supplemental Grant Fund, and a \$150,000 Community Development Block Grant Fund.

Mallis said the supplemental grant would be used to kick off the first phase of the plan for signage throughout the city.

He said officials have not decided on a project for the \$150,000 grant yet, but will be making a couple of different recommendations to council over the next month or two that will be addressed at upcoming council meetings.

SRO legislation passed

Council passed legislation to further define the agreement between the city and the Bedford Board of Education for the provision of a school resource officer (SRO) at Bedford High School, which the city has done since 2004.

"This is just to clean up some language that the state came up with for the school resource officer," Mayor Stan Koci said.

Mallis said that the SRO, Sean Francis, "has been with our department for many years, but I also want to mention not only the work he does with the school, but the partnership with the school district, the superinten-

dent and the school board, as it has been outstanding."

He said city officials have been exploring the possibility of additional resource officers throughout the district.

Other items on agenda

Placed on first reading at last week's meeting was an ordinance amending previous legislation authorizing the city to enter into an extension of the lease with option to purchase agreement with MRLM LLC, for the property located at 600 Solon Road.

The city has been attempting to sell the property to MRLM, and the lease with option to purchase agreement with Bedford for the property to operate a landscape material business was extended to December 31st of this year, according to the legislation, which states that the city and MRLM "have agreed on all terms regarding the property, with the exception that the parties need to extend the lease and option for an additional five years, due to unforeseen issues regarding financing." This legislation will be discussed before possible passage at a future meeting.

Also placed on first reading was an ordinance amending a contract with GPD Group for engineering services in the city in 2019, to allow for more information on the rates, and an ordinance amending previous legislation to establish pay ranges.

An ordinance for the city's budget for 2019, setting the figure for all expenses and expenditures at \$37,234,836, was placed on second reading for further discussion.

A motion to reappoint James (Dell) Judd to a three-year term with the Civil Service Commission was approved by council, as was a motion to appoint Rich Palcisko to a three-year term with the same commission.

Police officer sworn in

Koci swore in Larnell Roberts as the city's newest police officer at last week's meeting. Roberts, a veteran of the Cleveland Police Department, will serve as a patrolman, replacing another officer who recently took a job in another community, police officials stated.

Announcements

The annual "Lights Out For Hunger" event, during which homeowners are asked to turn off their holiday lighting displays for the evening and donate what they would have spent on their electric bills to the Southeast Clergy food pantry, will be held on Wednesday, Dec. 19, Koci stated. The First Baptist Church is handling the collection and distribution of the funds this year, he said.

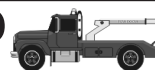
