Bank robbed in Garfield Commons

On Monday, April 29, at about 3 p.m., an unknown man entered First Federal of Lakewood, 12648 Rockside Rd., Garfield Heights, and presented a demand note for money, according to police. He was given an undisclosed amount of money and no physical injuries were reported.

Dump truck gets stuck under E. 49 St. bridge



Yesterday at about 7:40 a.m., a dump truck heading south on East 49th Street in Slavic Village had its bed raised while driving, causing it to wedge underneath the pedestrian bridge just north of Fleet Avenue, reports Joe Linsky, community engagement coordinator of Slavic Village Development. Crews closed the right two lanes of I-77 north and south between Fleet and Pershing avenues and worked with United Towing, G&M Towing and the city of Cleveland for more than two hours to strategically maneuver the truck to safety without damaging the bridge. There is some minor damage to the bridge that does not impact its structural integrity, according to Amanda McFarland, public information officer for ODOT District 12.

Suspect charged in Little Caesar's robbery in S.V.

A Cleveland man has been charged with aggravated robbery and felonious assault in the Slavic Village Little Caesar's robbery that occurred Friday, April 20, according to court records.

Martez Gordon, 27, is being held in the Cuyahoga County Jail on \$100,000 bond. A preliminary hearing is set for May 6 at 9 a.m.

Gordon is one of the suspects in the robbery at 7310 Harvard Ave., according to the police report. During the incident, three men came into the store wearing face masks and pointed handguns at employees. A male employee pulled a gun from his waistband and began to shoot at the suspects. The suspects ran to the back of the store, using the female employees as human shields and returned gunfire. The male employee was shot in the left arm and told police he heard one of the suspects say, "He shot me!"

The male employee drove himself to MetroHealth Hospital. Officers learned another man had arrived at St. Vincent Charity Medical Center with gunshot wounds to his legs. He was later transferred to MetroHealth.

Police interviewed the man, later identified as Gordon, who said he was shot during a dice game in the area of East 79th and Woodland Avenue. He was listed as Suspect No. 2 on the police report related to the incident.

Steals car, shoots at police

Officers responded to a call for an aggravated robbery of a motor vehicle at the Greater Gospel Temple at 2408 East 83rd Street on April 28 at about 9:15 a.m., according to a Cleveland police report. The 83-year-old female victim reported that her black Ford Taurus was taken at gunpoint by a black male.

She said she was sitting in her vehicle out in front of the church when a man knocked on the passenger side window. He then walked around the front of her car while pointing a silver firearm at her and told her to get out of the car or he would kill her. The woman got out of the vehicle and went into the church, where she called police. The suspect sped south on East 83rd Street, and the vehicle information was broadcast over police radio.

At about 11:10 a.m., officers responded to another call at the Fleet Avenue Super Wash laundromat at 6207 Fleet Ave. for a male driving a black Ford Taurus who was threatening a woman with a gun, according to the police report. The victim stated that while she was doing her laundry, a man came in and performed lewd acts in front of her. The victim told the man she was going to call the police. The man threatened to shoot her and exited the laundromat, then went to the car and waved his gun at her from outside the laundromat in a threatening manner.

A short time later officers spotted the vehicle and began pursuit, according to the report. Members of the Bureau of Traffic, the Fourth District, the Canine Unit and the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority Police Department were involved in the pursuit.

While the suspect fled police the stolen vehicle sustained damage and caught fire, according to the report. The suspect ran from the vehicle and officers pursued on foot. The suspect produced a handgun and began firing at the officers, who returned fire and hit the suspect multiple times. The suspect was taken to University Hospital.

Per protocol, the investigation relative to the shooting incident will be conducted by the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Office. The officers will be placed on administrative leave with pay for at least three days.

Rockside Road bridge in Maple Hts. now open to two-way traffic

The Rockside Road bridge in Maple Heights, scene of a significant water main break in early April, is now open to two-way traffic, one lane in each direction, while repairs to the bridge are ongoing, Maple Heights Mayor Annette Blackwell said Monday.

The bridge at Pennsylvania Avenue, also in close proximity to the Maple Heights-Bedford border and the busy intersection of Rockside Road and Broadway Avenue in Bedford, had to be closed down for about two weeks while the bridge structure and roadway were being assessed.

A 30-inch Cleveland Water Department main just west of the bridge over the Norfolk and Southern Railroad tracks broke the evening of Wednesday, April 10, sending a deluge of water onto the roadway, bridge and surrounding area resulting in the closure of a portion of Rockside Road and necessitating detours.

Once the repairs to the main are completed, normal restoration to two lanes of traffic each way will be maintained.

Men robbed, one shot near East 52nd in Slavic Village

On Saturday, April 27, at about 6:10 p.m., officers responded to the 3600 block of East 52nd Street in Slavic Village for a report of a man shot in the right foot, according to a police report. Officers did not find any suspects or shell casings but noticed a lot of blood on the sidewalk. The victim was at MetroHealth Hospital.

Officers went to the hospital and spoke with the man who had been shot in the foot. He stated that he and a friend went to the BP Gas Station on Fleet Avenue to meet up with a girl but could not find her. They then went north on East 50th Street to look for her. They

turned east on Kirkham Avenue when two unknown men approached them. The men pulled out black guns and told them to get on the ground. One of the men punched the victim in his left eye.

One of the suspects took the victim's wallet containing his driver's license, cell phone, Social Security card, birth certificate and \$150 in cash. The man then shot him in the right foot, according to the police report.

The victim's attending physician said that he had a broken bone in his right foot and possible hairline fractures along his left eye. Police took the bullet fragment from the foot as evidence.

The victim's friend gave a similar story, saying that during the incident an unknown man kicked him in the rib area to get him to roll over, then took his wallet, which contained his driver's license and \$200 to \$300 in cash. He also said that one of the men put the gun to the back of his head, but that a woman from across the street yelled at the men to stop, according to the police report. The men then fled the scene eastbound on East 52nd Street.

The first suspect is a black male with a gap in his front teeth standing 5'11" and wearing a black hoodie with a white stripe across the sleeve, black pants and black Nike shoes.

The second suspect is a light-skinned black male with a scar on his right eyebrow standing 5'5" and wearing a navy blue hoodie and tan Timberland boots, according to the report.

Shooting death of 1-year-old

The mother of a 10-year-old boy who police suspect fatally shot a 1-year-old boy appeared in Cleveland Municipal Court last Friday, April 26.

The mother is charged with obstructing justice and endangering children. She was released on bond and

court-supervised release. The case was bound over to the grand jury of the Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas for further proceedings. The 10-year-old has not been charged.

On April 20 at approximately 6:20 p.m., officers responded to an address in the 14200 block of Rexwood Avenue in Cleveland near the Garfield Heights border for a shooting incident involving a 1-year-old male victim, according to Cleveland police. The child was transported from the residence to MetroHealth Medical Center for treatment. He was pronounced deceased at the hospital. The matter remains under investigation.

Indicted in large drug conspiracy

A Maple Heights man and 19 others were indicted in a conspiracy to obtain large amounts of heroin, fentanyl and fentanyl analogues and sell the drugs to customers on the west side of Cleveland.

Travon Gales, 24, of Maple Heights, was named in the 27-count indictment on one count of conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute heroin, fentanyl and fentanyl analogue and firearms crimes.

According to the indictment, two Sheffield Lake residents obtained quantities of heroin, fentanyl and fentanyl analogues, which they sold to Gales and other dealers and customers in Cleveland. Gales and others then sold heroin and fentanyl to others mentioned in the indictment, who went on to resell the drugs.

Gales and others carried firearms to protect themselves, their drugs and their drug proceeds. The conspiracy took place between September 2017 and April 2019, according to the indictment.

Bedford PD's K-9 officer gets body armor donation

Bedford Police Department's K9 Luca has received a bullet and stab protective vest thanks to a charitable donation from nonprofit organization Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. Luca's vest is sponsored by Cherdon Gates of Westerville, OH and is embroidered with the sentiment "Born to Love-Trained to Serve-Loyal Always."

Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. is a 501c (3) charity whose mission is to provide bullet and stab protective vests and other assistance to dogs of law enforcement and related agencies throughout the United States. It was established in 2009 to assist law enforcement agencies with this potentially lifesaving body armor for their four-legged K-9 officers. Since its inception, Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. has provided over 3,200 protective vests in 50 states, through private and corporate donations, at a value of \$5.7 million.

The program is open to dogs actively employed in

the U.S. with law enforcement or related agencies who are certified and at least 20 months of age. New K-9 graduates, as well as K-9s with expired vests, are eligible to participate.

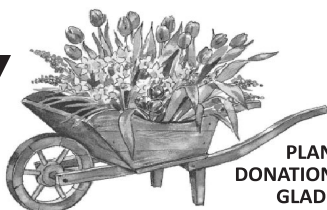

Burglary

On April 9 at about 1:30 p.m., officers responded to the 8300 block of Grand Division Avenue for a burglary report. The resident said he left his home between 12:30 p.m. and 1:30 p.m. while his wife was outside doing yard work in the backyard. When he returned, he noticed a door on the east side of the home that is normally closed was slightly open. He checked the door and discovered that the screen door was open but still locked. He then went to the bedroom and discovered that the drawer of his night stand was slightly open and that someone had removed his firearm, a black Bersa .380. The gun was kept inside an olive green zip-up carrying case. Along with the gun, two loaded magazines were missing. There were no signs of forced entry and no apparent evidence on the scene.

OVI

On April 27 at about 11:15 p.m., an officer noticed a vehicle impeding traffic southbound on Turney Road at Garfield Boulevard. The vehicle was stopped at a green light and not moving. The officer pulled next to the vehicle and noticed the driver was asleep. The officer activated her lights and sirens, and another officer arrived and placed his cruiser in front of the car. After officers tapped on the glass several times, the driver woke up. He appeared to be in a confused state and put the vehicle in park. Officers removed

the keys. The driver had the odor of alcoholic beverages on his person, and he refused standardized field sobriety tests. He was placed under arrest without incident and refused a BAC test. He was charged with OVI, impeding the flow of traffic and improper handling of a firearm.

On April 26 at about 12:30 a.m., officers responded to the 4800 block of East 84th Street for a report of a vehicle that struck a parked car. Both parties confirmed that one of the men struck the left-rear of the other man's vehicle, which was parked and unoccupied at the time. Officers noted a strong odor of alcoholic beverage coming from the driver who struck the vehicle. He initially said that mechanical failure was the cause of the accident but then admitted to looking down at his phone. He failed standardized field sobriety tests and was arrested without incident. His BAC test at the jail yielded a .211. He was charged with OVI, prohibited BAC and failure to control.

On April 18 at about 8:20 a.m., officers responded to the area of Wadsworth Ave. and 110th Street for a hit/skip accident. One of the vehicles had fled the scene and was traced to an address in the 17000 block of Maple Heights Blvd. Officers went to the address and spoke to the resident, who admitted to driving the vehicle. While speaking to the man, officers noticed he appeared disheveled and confused and had an odor of alcoholic beverage coming from him. After a field sobriety test, the man was arrested for operating under the influence of alcohol. At the station, he submitted to a breath test with a result of .188 BAC. He was cited for stop sign violation, hit/skip, OVI and testing above .17 BAC.

Stolen vehicles

On April 18 at about 7:15 p.m., officers responded to the 14100 block of Cranwood Park Boulevard for a report of a motorcycle theft from a resident's garage.

On April 17 at about 10:45 a.m., officers responded to the

12300 block of Oakpark Blvd. for a report of a stolen vehicle. The woman said the vehicle was stolen while she was on vacation between 10 p.m. April 13 and 10:45 a.m. April 17. She also stated her vehicle had been broken into several times previously.

Aggravated robbery

On April 23 at about 5:50 p.m., officers responded to Metro PCS at 9312 Harvard Ave. for a report of an attempted armed robbery. When police arrived, there was a man laying behind the register/counter area who was bleeding and having trouble talking. The man was transferred to MetroHealth Hospital.

The store owner said the man entered the store and stated that he wanted to pay his phone bill. He began saying some numbers while walking toward the register, then produced a black handgun and said, "Don't move." The owner removed his firearm and shot at the man three times. The man fell to the ground, and the owner kicked the firearm away from him. The owner held the man at gunpoint until officers arrived.

Video footage from the store matched the owner's account of the events. The owner said the store had been robbed at gunpoint about eight times in the last year.

The man was treated for gunshot wounds to his left upper leg, right side stomach and right hand and was in stable condition.

M.H. police searching for robbery suspects

On Friday, April 26, at about 3:38 p.m., Maple Heights police received a report of shots fired in the area of Hillgrove Avenue.

Upon arrival officers spoke to a male victim who stated he was in his driveway when two young, male juveniles approached him. The boys distracted him while two teenage males approached from the backyard. They were armed with handguns and robbed him of his car keys and cell phone. The victim stated one of the males fired a shot at him as they ran toward Prayner Avenue.

The victim followed the four males westbound on Franklin Road. One of them fired four additional rounds in the victim's direction. They fled southbound

through the backyards. No one was injured in this incident, and the identity of the suspects is still under investigation.

One of the teenage males had on a red hoodie and dark-colored pants. The other teenage male had on a grey hoodie with blue jeans. Both had their hoods concealing their faces.

One of the young juvenile males had on a black hooded sweater and black pants. The second younger juvenile male had on a red hooded sweater and light-colored pants.
