Cleveland man sentenced to 15-16½ years in prison for violent crime spree

Cuyahoga County Prosecutor Michael C. O'Malley announced last week that Clifford Gillespie, 44, was sentenced to 15 to 16½ years in prison for a violent crime spree that occurred within a three-hour timespan in April 2019.

"We are all much safer without this criminal running rampant through our streets," O'Malley said.

On April 28, 2019, Gillespie carjacked the victim, an 83-year-old woman, at gunpoint in a church parking lot near E. 83 St. and Quincy Ave. He approached her vehicle, banged on her windows and demanded her car keys while threatening to kill her.

After the victim exited her vehicle, he took her keys and drove away.

Shortly after, Gillespie drove the stolen vehicle to a laundromat near E. 63 St. and Fleet Ave. The defendant began fondling himself in the parking lot in front of a woman, 27, and her cousin. After she told him to stop, he verbally threatened her life and retrieved a gun from the stolen vehicle. He pointed the gun at the victim as he approached her. She ran to the back of the laundromat and called police before Gillespie fled the scene in the vehicle.

Shortly after, Cleveland Division of Police spotted the stolen vehicle and attempted to pull him over near E. 74 St. and Harvard Ave. Gillespie refused and a brief pursuit ensued before he exited the vehicle and ran into a wooded area near E. 79 St. and Holton Ave. He hid inside a tent as officers with CPD and Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Police gave several commands to surrender. Gillespie refused and made another attempt to flee as he ran toward E. 83 St. before pointing his gun at responding officers. Officers fired on Gillespie, striking him twice in the leg and arm.

He pleaded guilty to the following charges:

- One count of aggravated robbery
- Five counts of felonious assault
- Two counts of having weapons under disability
- Two counts of aggravated menacing
- One count of public indecency

Maple Hts. files lawsuit against Netflix, Hulu seeking video service provider fees

The city of Maple Heights has filed a lawsuit in U.S. District Court against video service providers Netflix and Hulu, to seek what could amount to millions of dollars in video service provider fees for the city.

Attorney Mark DiCello of DiCello Levitt Guzler LLC, a law firm based in Mentor, is handling the case for the city, according to Maple Heights Law Director Frank Consolo, who referred inquiries to DiCello's office.

DiCello furnished this reporter a copy of the lawsuit, which was filed in U.S. District Court, Northern District of Ohio, Cleveland Division, on Friday, Aug. 21.

Described as a "Class Action Complaint" with demand for a jury trial, the lawsuit alleges that Netflix and Hulu "provide video service in Ohio municipalities. When doing so, they use wireline facilities (i.e., broadband wireline facilities), located at least in part in public rights-of-way... accordingly, [Netflix and Hulu] should be and are required by law to pay each of those municipalities a video service provider fee of up to 5% of their gross revenue, as derived from their providing video service in that municipality."

Also alleged in the filing is that Netflix and Hulu "have failed to pay the required fee, necessitating this lawsuit, and entitling [Maple Heights] and the putative class, to the relief requested herein."

The lawsuit states that the primary business of the Netflix Corporation, headquartered in Los Gatos, California, and also of Hulu, a limited liability company headquartered in Santa Monica, California, is their video services which offer online streaming of films and television programs, as well as the distribution and production of original films and television series.

Both Netflix and Hulu do business in Maple Heights, "and has done so at all times, relevant to this action," the lawsuit states, adding that the "aggregate amount in controversy for the proposed class exceeds \$5,000,000, exclusive of interest and costs."

Factual allegations in the lawsuit state that Netflix and Hulu "provide video service to their subscribers... using an Internet-connected device."

Subsequently, when Netflix and/or Hulu subscribers wish to view programming on those services, they use an Internet-connected device to send a request to the Internet service provider (ISP), according to the lawsuit, which states that the ISP "then forwards that request to Netflix's and Hulu's dedicated Internet servers, which, in turn, provide a response. This response is then relayed back to the subscriber's device, and Netflix and Hulu deliver the video programming via Internet protocol technology (i.e., broadband wireline facilities) located at least in part in public rights-of-way."

On June 25, 2007, then-Ohio Gov. Ted Strickland signed Senate Bill 117 into law, which allowed Ohio municipalities to collect franchise fees from video service providers for the first time, effective Sept. 24, 2007.

Consequently, according to Ohio Revised Code, S.B. 117 allows local franchising authorities to collect up to 5% of gross revenues, defined in the statute to exclude a variety of revenues that are currently allowed under federal law. However, to continue to collect franchise fees, municipalities were required to pass legislation stating the percentage of gross revenues collected.

Maple Heights has passed legislation to this effect, according to the lawsuit, which states, "Many Ohio municipalities, including Maple Heights, have enacted local ordinances that impose a video provider service fee of 5% on all video service providers... the Ohio Director of Commerce would have authorized video service providers such as [Netflix and Hulu] to use public rights-of-way, as long as said video service provider makes a quarterly video service provider payment to each city in which it provides video service... the required video service provider payment is up to 5% of gross revenues received... from the provision of video services in the city."

The lawsuit also alleges that Netflix and Hulu were required to receive authorization from the Ohio Director of Commerce “and provide 10 days advance, written notice before providing video service in Maple Heights and the other Ohio municipalities in which they provide their video services.”

Netflix’s and Hulu’s respective “failure to receive authorization and provide advance, written notice did not relieve them of the obligation to pay the video service provider fee,” according to the allegations presented in the filing.

DiCello, Blackwell comment

When contacted yesterday, DiCello emphasized the importance of what Mayor Annette Blackwell was attempt-

ing through the filing of the lawsuit, to pursue revenue for the city. “I think the ordinance is clear, that the citizens of Maple Heights are entitled to the revenues, and it’s important that the mayor of Maple Heights, like other mayors, stands up for the citizens to demand the payments.”

DiCello stated that the lawsuit follows the ordinance passed by the city, as well as in communities throughout the United States, adding that Blackwell and other leaders “do the best they can for the community... I think it’s important for political leaders to identify issues like the mayor has identified, to serve the electorate by enforcing those rules.”

Blackwell stated yesterday, “At every opportunity that I am able to return to the residents of the city of Maple Heights what is owed to them, I will pursue it.”

Media relations departments for both Netflix and Hulu were contacted to offer them the opportunity to comment on the lawsuit. There was no response from Netflix as of press time. The response from Hulu was as follows: “Unfortunately, your access to Hulu’s Press site has been denied.”

always has been, to return students to school buildings safely as soon as possible.

"If that time is shorter than nine weeks, then I want to be prepared to make that change and get our students back in our buildings," Evans said.

He said advance notice will be provided to make that change. "In other words, I will not send out an 'all call' on a Friday to return the following Monday.

Teachers are leading the district's interactive remote instruction. Therefore, when parents receive their child's class and remote learning schedules, that instruction will be delivered Cuyahoga Heights Schools staff members.

When students transition back to the buildings for in-school instruction, building principals will share specifics of the dynamics of the various learning options for their school.

The schools will be using a communication application called Remind for consistent two-way communication between school and home.

"It is imperative that all of the information you (students, parents) have input into Final Forms is up-to-date and accurate as that is the database that feeds the contact information system," the superintendent stressed.

The schools are transitioning away from info@cuyhts.org so that parents can contact the members of the administrative team directly with questions. Each member’s email address is listed on the school website.

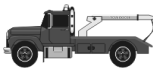

A witness told police he had seen a black Ford Fusion with heavy tint and factory rims travel eastbound down Gertrude at a high rate of speed. The driver was

described as a "white boy named Nate." The shooter, who was a passenger in the car, was described as a dark skin black male, thin build, about 20-to 30-years-old, wearing a red face mask. Another witness said she had cameras that may have recorded what happened.

Maple Heights City Schools announce remote opening

The start of the school year for Maple Heights School District students will begin on Tuesday, Sept. 8.

General academic information

Remote learning will take place at least through the end of the first 9-week period. Students will have clear daily expectation of learning through both synchronous (in real time) and asynchronous (outside of real time learning) expectations. It is expected, and staff will be prepared to ensure, that students will receive high quality learning aligned with the curriculum throughout this time.

Time will be included in the weekly schedule to allow students to interact either individually or in small groups with their teachers, tutors and/or paraprofessionals.

Because the district is not fully 1:1 with technology learning with devices, a district master schedule is being created that ensures synchronous learning in math and language arts are not interrupted by other grades. Synchronous learning will still be expected to occur in other subject areas, but students who are unable to log on during any synchronous session due to conflicts in their siblings math and language arts schedule will be expected to participate daily in the recorded sessions for those subjects, as well as

completing all asynchronous work.

Online attendance will be taken daily and a process is being developed for staff to communicate with families and students when students are not present daily to identify and troubleshoot issues.

There will be two groups of students who will be offered the opportunity to receive regular face-to-face support: pre-school students and students with intensive needs disabilities. Schedules of that face-to-face interaction for those students will be developed to promote safety of students, staff and families. Participation of students in these face-to-face offerings will not be mandatory.

Guardians of students in these categories will be asked to identify whether or not they will elect to do any face-to-face services.

Students in grades K-3 will have the opportunity for some face-to-face support in addition to the remote learning platform to address early learning needs especially around literacy. Schedules and capacity of that face-to-face interaction will be developed to promote safety of students, staff and families. Participation of students in these face-to-face offerings will not be mandatory.

Each student and their guardian will be invited to participate in a scheduled, individualized meeting prior to the start of the student school year. This meeting will enable students to get to know their teacher, receive technology if needed, receive support on how to use technology and applicable software to learn remotely in the teacher's class, and to build rapport between the students, their

family and their teacher.

Additional opportunities for students and families to interact with teachers will be integrated remotely through "office hours," and in-person support will also be accessible through appointments for families throughout the remote learning period.

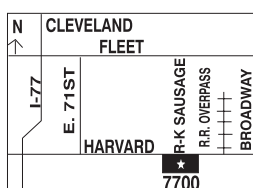
