GHPD responds to kidnapping on Bangor; woman locked in car, robbed

Early last Saturday morning, at about 6:15 a.m., Garfield Heights police were dispatched to the 13000 block of Bangor Avenue in reference to a report of a kidnapping in progress.

Officers found a homeowner bound and locked inside her vehicle. She told police she had arrived home earlier in the morning and parked her car in the driveway. As she attempted to enter the residence she was approached by two men, armed with handguns, struck in the face and eventually bound.

The suspects entered her home and stole several items, then locked the woman in her own car before fleeing the area. The incident is being further investigated by the GHPD. Anyone with information is asked to contact the Garfield Heights Detective Bureau at 216-475-5686.

Garfield Hts. Council holds last meeting of term

Monday night was a time for saying good-bye to some of the current council members and hello to the newest K9 officer in the Garfield Heights Police Department, as "Creed" was sworn into duty with his handler, Sgt. Carlos Crespo.

With the General Election coming up this Tuesday, there will be some new council members to welcome when the November 8th meeting takes place and the election winners are sworn in.

Retiring members, Ward 1 Councilman Michael Dudley, Sr. and Ward 3 Councilman Mike Nenadovich, with their

families present, were honored by council with resolutions for their "outstanding and dedicated service to the city of Garfield Heights."

Dudley has been on council for the last 14 years and is currently council's president pro tem.

Nenadovich has served on council for 12 years and is currently council president.

Also passed at Monday's meeting was legislation to:

- Enter into a contract with the Cuyahoga County Health District to provide health services to the city for the years 2022-23.

- Amend and supplement the city's classification and compensation for non-union pay positions. This was made necessary as the mayor plans to create the position of senior center manager in the Social Services Department.

- Execute the amended "Urban Jobs and Enterprise Zone Agreement" between the city and JT Leonard Contractors LLC and JTL Granger 9601 LLC for the purpose of providing incentives for the development of an Urban Jobs and Enterprise Zone.

- Appoint five members to the Garfield Heights Land Reutilization Program Neighborhood Advisory Committee starting immediately and ending Dec. 31, 2023. Those members are: Donna Bell, Trudy Bordonaro, Cotilia Decembly, Eileen Gryszel and Colleen Korpowski.

Cleveland Council highlights

Cleveland City Council held its regular weekly meeting Monday night and authorized the city's Department of Public Works to enter into an agreement with Burten, Bell, Carr Development, Inc., for the Garden of the Eleven Angels Project which will place a memorial monument at a public greenspace located on Imperial Avenue, memorializing eleven women who were victims of violence at that site.

Funding is available through the use of Wards 2, 4, 5 and 6 casino revenue funds, plus capital repair funds. The cost is capped at \$50,000.

Council also passed legislation authorizing the city to enter into both a loan agreement and a grant agreement with Manufacturing Advocacy & Growth Network, Inc., (MAGNET) to provide the company with \$1 million in assistance for the purchase of new machinery and equipment at its new headquarters at 1800 E. 63 St., the former Margaret Ireland School.

The assistance will also help with new construction and other costs necessary to redevelop the property. The costs of the agreements include a non-forgivable loan in the amount of \$500,000 and a grant in the amount of \$500,000 to assist with construction costs at the project site.

As part of the project they will create a Manufacturing Innovation, Technology, and Job Center. The building will be redeveloped to include opportunities and features designed to help manufacturing companies adopt to cutting-edge technologies and business processes, develop the city's manufacturing workforce, especially in underserved communities, and create a community asset with public space for the Hough community.

Also adopted were two pieces of legislation affecting rate structures for water service and water pollution control. The city's department of Water Pollution Control currently includes minimum rates, regardless of usage. One part of the legislation would phase out the minimum charge, resulting in lower bills for lower users.

However, for most homeowners the bill would increase by about 90 cents a month next year and an additional \$1.05 the following year. Larger homes, businesses and other commercial property would see larger increases. Discounts continue to be available for senior citizens or

income-eligible customers. Utility officials noted that there are more than 500 miles of 100-year-old underground infrastructure that needs to be replaced.

The other legislation addresses water rates from the Division of Water. Cleveland and suburban residents will not see an increase until 2024. At that time the average water-user will see a 3.5% increase which works out to be 87 cents a month. The city has 400,000 water customers in Northeast Ohio.

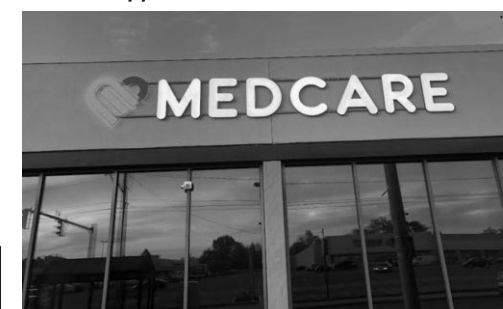

Maple Hts. beginning annual door-to-door housing inspections

In looking towards 2022, the Maple Heights Building Department is implementing an annual Door-To-Door Inspection Program, with the possibility of a grant program to assist residents with their potential expenses, Mayor Annette Blackwell stated earlier this week.

The program involves the city's building department making exterior maintenance housing inspections, Blackwell stated. "This program will ensure that all parts of the city receive equal care and attention, help maintain the city's housing stock, and, in the long term, prevent properties from deteriorating to the point that they need to be demolished."

Officials will inspect all approximately 10,000 residential properties in the city on a five-year rotating basis in each of the seven council districts.

"To begin the program, the department has identified a

street or section of small streets in each council district to inspect this fall, 2021. In some districts, these inspections have already begun," the mayor stated, adding that the annual door-to-door program will begin again in the spring of 2022.

Blackwell said that those houses that are found to have violations will be given a violation notice, with an initial compliance date of Thursday, March 31, 2022. "But if we are still experiencing winter weather in March, the compliance date will automatically be extended to April 30, 2022, and if residents need additional time, they should contact the building department and a compliance extension can be granted."

"The city recognizes that this is the first time in a long time that the city is implementing such a program, and that such repairs are not inexpensive," Blackwell stated. She said she is including in the 2022 budget proposal, funding for an Exterior Maintenance Grant Program, and exploring opportunities to work with other home repair loan programs which will be able to assist residents in making some of these repairs.

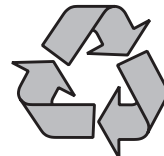

Independence Council update

The city of Independence met virtually on Oct. 12, and passed on second reading an ordinance authorizing the full redemption of the city's Various Purpose Refunding Bonds, Series 2011 (limited tax obligation) and declaring an emergency.

Other legislation passed under the Consent Agenda included:

- Approving the hiring of Robert Butler as police chief of the Independence Police Department on first reading under suspension of the rules.

- Authorizing on first reading entering into a Job Relocation and Creation Grant Agreement with Chromascape, Inc., 2055 Enterprise Parkway, Twinsburg, in connection with relocating its operations to a location within the corporate boundaries of the city.

- Repealing an ordinance establishing premium pay and work-related clothing and maintenance benefits for full-time non-bargaining supervisory service department employees. Mayor Kurtz said there is a provision in the ordinance seeking repeal that if you put so many hours in, you would have an additional stipend of pay; and so they are monitoring their hours rather than efficiency. The recommendation was to remove it so that supervisors "are no longer harnessed with having to watch the clock as much as performance."

- Contracting with the Cuyahoga County General Health District for public health services in the total amount of \$50,054.00 for year 2022 and \$45,504.00 for year 2023.

- Purchasing an eight-yard refuse truck for the Service Department in an amount not to exceed \$71,900.00.

- Purchasing a new 5,000 lb. capacity lift truck for the Service Department in an

amount not to exceed \$39,000.66, and additional equipment for the truck, in an amount not to exceed \$697.90, for a total amount not to exceed \$39,698.56.

- Accepting the bids for snow plowing services for municipal lots and seniors citizens/disabled persons/active military residents for the 2021-22 snow season in an amount not to exceed \$70,000.

- Authorizing the purchase and installation of 23 in-vehicle computer systems on 23 police department vehicles.

- Amending a special condition use permit for accessory uses to Saucy Brew Works for property located at Rockside Woods Boulevard.

- Authorizing the mayor to enter into an amendment to the 2018 Job Creation Grant Agreement with Topgolf.

- Authorizing the purchase and installation of a Splash Pad for Elmwood Park.

- Accepting the proposals of Environmental Systems Research Institute, Inc., Geographic Information Services, Inc. and Shi International Corp. for software licensing and professional services to develop a GIS program.

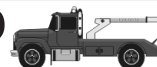

Charter Amendments

Proposed Charter Amendment Village of Cuyahoga Heights

A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage.

Shall Article I, Section 4 of the Charter of the Village of Cuyahoga Heights be amended to replace the Village Clerk with the Village Chief Fiscal Officer as it relates to the authority to utilize the Village's Sewer User Charge Fund?

Shall Article II, Sections 1, 1A, 1B, 2, 3, and 4 of the Charter of the Village of Cuyahoga Heights be amended to eliminate the elected office of Clerk of Council?

Shall Article V, Section 4 of the Charter of the Village of Cuyahoga Heights be amended to permit appointments in the Fire Department and Police Department may also be made by lateral transfer in accordance with established legislation?

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Maple Hts. Councilman Trojanski facing recall election on November 23rd

Maple Heights Council passed a motion at its meeting last week to approve a special recall election on Nov. 23. District 6 Councilman Richard Trojanski is facing recall after enough signatures were gathered from voters in his district and turned into the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections, the city's law director, Frank Consolo, stated.

Consolo emphasized that the motion passed by council was not to recall Trojanski, explaining, "Council does not have the power to recall any of its members. It was merely a motion to set the date for a recall election which council is mandated to do once a valid recall petition has been filed against a council person."

He continued that on Monday, Oct. 11, Council Clerk Leonette Cicirella received petitions signed by 122 residents of District 6 seeking the recall of Trojanski.

A minimum of 116 signatures of District 6's registered voters were needed to make the petitions valid, and the recall petitions were sufficient by only one with 117 valid signatures, as certified by the Board of Elections to Cicirella.

Consolo pointed out that on the ballot, after asking the question, "Shall Richard Trojanski be removed from the office of Member of Council District 6 by recall?," there will be a provision on the ballot for electors to vote either for or against the question. Also on the ballot, he said, there will be the names of any candidate(s) nominated to succeed Trojanski as councilman for District 6.

The filing deadline for successor candidates to file candidate petitions with the Board of Elections is Thursday, Oct. 29, 2021 at 4 p.m., with a minimum of 25 valid signatures obtained from qualified electors of District 6.

"If a majority of electors vote for the recall, then the person receiving the most votes as a candidate for District 6 shall succeed Councilman Trojanski," Consolo said. "If a majority of electors vote against the recall, then Coun-

cilman Trojanski will remain in office, despite the number of votes received by any candidates to succeed him."

The voter registration deadline for the Maple Heights District 6 Recall Election is Monday, Oct. 25, 2021 at 9 p.m. Registration information received by the deadline applies to the November 23, 2021 Maple Heights District 6 Recall Election only.

Consolo stated that the Board of Elections has advised Maple Heights that it will be sending a letter to all of the 2,384 registered voters in District 6 to explain the recall election procedures. He also stated that the estimated cost to the city for this special election is \$6,800.

Trojanski responds

Trojanski made a brief statement on the matter at the beginning of his report at last week's meeting, following council's approval of the motion.

He said, "I know we've just heard some disappointing news, but this is not the time or the place to address my constituents. I will address my constituents at a more appropriate time and at a more appropriate venue, and I just want to add that this, too, shall pass."

Trojanski was contacted after the meeting for further comment on the special election and to address any possible reasons stated by District 6 residents for his recall, and released the following statement on Monday, Oct. 25:

"This recall is unwarranted and simply an attempt to short-circuit the process, to try to skirt a process where someone was duly elected and is doing exactly what he said he was going to do," he stated, adding, "I'm being scapegoated for an election outcome that some voters did not like."

Trojanski, who has publicly declared his openly gay status as a member of Maple Heights Council, stated, "In addition, this is a personal attack against me. It's also

deeply rooted against me because of my sexual orientation, yet smoothly crafted by my previous opponent and her followers." He did not disclose the name of the opponent in his statement.
