Free Solar Farm 'Lunch and Learn' event at PACC

Please join the South East Cleveland Kiwanis and Slavic Village Development for a Solar Farm "Lunch and Learn" event at the Polish American Cultural Center and Museum, 6501 Lansing Ave., Cleveland, on Thursday, July 10, from noon to 1:30 p.m.

Cuyahoga County was awarded a Climate Pollution Reduction Grant by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency last year. The grant will fund the deployment of 63 megawatts (MW) of solar installations on five brownfield and previous landfill sites and 10 MW of battery storage. The grant funds will also support the restoration of natural habitats and expand tree coverage on a blighted brownfield site along the shoreline of Lake Erie and create pollinator habitats at the Cleveland and Cuyahoga solar sites.

"This is a huge win for the Broadway/Slavic Village Community to help reclaim and reuse a portion of the closed Harvard Road landfill and put it back to productive use," said former Ward 12 Councilman Tony Brancatelli. A portion of the landfill will be topped with solar panels to generate about 4 megawatts with a proposed goal to sell its power to Cleveland Public Power.

"Slavic Village Development and local officials have been planning on reuse strategies for the past decade and this federal grant will help realize this creative land use and create a more sustainable environment and help reduce global warming," Brancatelli noted.

CEP Renewables Senior Project Development Manager Kurt Princic will give a presentation on the solar farm development and Slavic Village Development Director of Neighborhood Planning, Krystal Sierra, will speak on the CDC's role and community engagement. Bedford Heights City Council bans marijuana-related businesses

At its meeting on Tuesday, July 1, Bedford Heights City Council approved three pieces of emergency legislation, including an application for a Community Development Block Grant, the city's annual tax budget for 2026, and a ban on issuing permits and certificates of occupancy for marijuana-related businesses.

By a 5-2 vote, council approved legislation which places a ban on issuing building permits or certificates of occupancy for any facility intended to cultivate, process or sell medical or recreational marijuana.

The resolution cites potential safety concerns and marijuana's designation as a Schedule 1 controlled substance by the federal government as reasons for the ban. It also highlights the possibility of increased criminal activity associated with marijuana businesses, such as robbery, theft, money laundering, tax evasion or other crimes constituting threats to the public's health, safety and wellness.

The resolution states that "unless and until" federal laws are amended to legalize medicinal or recreational cannabis, the issuance of building permits and certificates of occupancy which would allow for the cultivation, processing and dispensing of both medical and recreational marijuana will remain banned in the city.

Council unanimously passed a resolution authorizing Mayor Phillip Stevens to apply for grant funding through the Cuyahoga County Department of Community Development Block Grant Program. If awarded, the funds would be utilized for a local improvement project selected by the mayor and council.

Council also unanimously passed a resolution adopting the city's tax budget for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2026. The budget was prepared by Stevens and Finance Director John Baranek. Copies are available for public inspection in the Finance Department and the office of the clerk of council.

In the morning, during club hours, members will walk with signs to Haven Home to deliver toiletries and return to the club.

Knockout competition members will include several local notables, including Cavs legend Campy Russell and Myesha Watkins, administrator of the new Cuyahoga County Office of Violence Protection. Participating organizations will discuss their roles in reducing violence.

Boys & Girls Clubs of Northeast Ohio provides safe, fun places for kids ages 6-18 to go after school with a focus on academic success, healthy lifestyles, character development and life/career readiness. BGCNEO was formed through the 2019 merger of clubs in Cleveland, Akron, Lorain County and Sandusky.

Summer Crisis Program offers Ohioans help to stay cool this summer

The Ohio Department of Development and Step Forward are once again offering assistance to help Ohio’s families stay cool during the hot summer months.

From July 1 through Sept. 30, income-eligible Ohioans can receive assistance in paying their electric bills, purchasing an air conditioner or fan, or making repairs to their central air conditioning unit through the Ohio Department of Development’s Home Energy Assistance Summer Crisis Program (HEAP).

“We’re proud to partner with community action agencies across the state to deliver this critical support during the hottest months of the year,” said Lydia Mihalik, director of the Ohio Department of Development, which administers the program. “Time after time, this program has proven to be a vital lifeline for countless Ohioans when temperatures start to rise.”

The Summer Crisis Program assists low-income households or those that have a disconnection notice, have been shut off, are trying to establish new service on their electric bill, require air conditioning, or those with a person 60 years or older living in the home, or who can provide physician documentation that cooling assistance is needed for their health. Qualifying medical conditions can include lung disease, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease, asthma and others.

To qualify for assistance, Ohioans must have a gross income at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines for a family of up to eight members, and 60% of the State Median Income for a family of nine or more members. For a family of four, the annual income must be at or below \$56,262.50.

Last year, the Summer Crisis Program assisted more than 44,000 households in Ohio, providing a total of \$13.5 million in benefits.

Starting this year, applying for assistance and managing an account will be easier than ever. A new, streamlined online portal will be available at energyhelp.ohio.gov. To get started, Ohioans must register for an OHID account, which provides a secure and convenient way to access their HEAP account.

Registration takes less than 7 minutes, and can be completed in these easy steps:

- Visit energyhelp.ohio.gov, and click “Log into the EA portal.”
- Click “Create an OHID,” and follow the six-step account creation process.
- Ensure account security by setting up multi-factor authentication.

To apply for the program, clients are required to schedule an appointment with Step Forward. Appointments can be scheduled by calling 216-480-HEAP (4327).

“During the hottest months, keeping families in Cuyahoga County safe and comfortable is top priority,” said Jacqueline Boehnlein, Step Forward’s vice president of Community Services. “This program provides essential help to households who might otherwise struggle to afford cooling their homes, protecting health and well-being when it matters most.”

Attempted Breaking & Entering

On June 27, at about noon, police were dispatched to Trinity High School on a report that the same males who had broken into Trinity on June 17, had attempted to gain access again. The complainant said they had tried to break into the north side window and that the insulation was pulled out, but it did not appear they gained access to the building. Video surveillance showed the males driving two Trinity trucks and a van around the parking lot but all three vehicles were on the lot at the time the report was made. Report forwarded to the Detective Bureau.

Theft From Auto

• On July 1, an officer spoke with a man by telephone regarding a theft. The complainant said that on June 25, between 10 and 11 a.m., someone entered his unlocked Toyota while it was parked at Giant Eagle, 5744 Transportation Blvd., and stole his wallet which contained a credit card, bank card and assorted membership cards.

• On July 2, at 8:24 a.m., police spoke to a man over the phone for a reported theft of a license plate. He said his brother had discovered that his mother's rear license plate was missing from her 2023 Kia Seltos, parked in the driveway of her home in the 12700 block of Christine Ave. The mother is unsure when the plate was stolen.

Attempted Auto Theft

On July 1, about 8 p.m., police were dispatched to Trinity High School when a caller said she witnessed two males trying to steal a Honda van on the property and fled when confronted. Multiple calls had been received by police on these subjects, reportedly two black males both wearing black face masks. On arrival at Trinity an officer saw two black males walking east on Granger Rd. matching the description of the suspects. He turned around and pulled into the skate park and confronted the males. A witness was able to positively identify the males as those who

had attempted to steal the van from Trinity's parking lot. The two were placed under arrest and one of the suspects was found to have a Trinity High School lanyard with keys to multiple vehicles that are parked in the Trinity lot along with a separate Honda key attached to a keychain with "Trinity" written on it. The males were taken to city jail and booked without incident. Both were held for investigation of attempted motor vehicle theft. They were also identified as having allegedly broken into Trinity on June 12, 2025.

Theft

• On July 2, an officer spoke to a woman over the phone who reported a theft at Marymount Villa. The complainant said a credit card belonging to Marymount Health Center LLC was stolen and used several times in the last few months. The complainant was just made aware of the non-approved charges. She said she has seen several transactions listing a gas station in Garfield Heights on her bank statements. The credit card has now been cancelled. She is uncertain who took the credit card and who is making these purchases.

• On July 5, about 8:30 p.m., an officer met a woman in the station lobby reporting a theft. She said she lives in the 12800 block of Oakpark Blvd., and noticed several items were stolen from her garage and the car that was parked in her driveway. She had left for work that day at 8 a.m. and returned about 5 p.m., to find a basketball hoop, misc. fireworks, push lawn mower and two leaf blowers missing from her garage. She said she had accidentally left her car unlocked and missing from it were a purse containing several credit cards, an HP laptop and a pair of Prada prescription glasses.

Shots Fired

On July 6, at 7:06 p.m., police were dispatched to a home in the 5100 block of E. 88 St., for a report of

approximately 16 gunshots fired. The residents of the home told officers they had seen a black male, slim, about 6 feet tall wearing a ski mask standing at the intersection of E. 88 St. and McCracken Blvd. with a gun in his hand. The male fired about 16 shots at the residence. He then left, going east on McCracken Blvd. Witnesses said he got into a blue vehicle. No injuries were reported at the time of the shootings. Officers blocked off the intersection of E. 88 St. and South Highland Ave., and E. 88 St. and McCracken Blvd., and began canvassing the area for shell casings. They located 15 casings. All were from a Luger 9mm. Police searched the area for any properties struck by the gunfire and found 11 out of the 15 shots fired were discovered to have struck at four different properties.

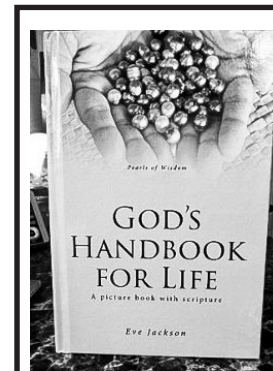
