Fatal crash early Monday in Maple Hts.

On Monday, March 16, around 12:15 a.m., the Maple Heights Police Department received a call of a motor vehicle accident in front of a home in the 5400 block of Dunham Rd. When police arrived they located one victim involved in the accident and observed that the vehicle had possibly struck very large landscaping stones and came to rest in the roadway.

The victim was pronounced deceased on scene. The victim's identification and notification of next of kin is ongoing before any victim details can be released. The cause of the crash is under investigation by the Southeast Area Law Enforcement Accident Investigation Unit-SEALE AIU and the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office. Speed is believed to be a factor in the accident and all drivers are urged to drive defensively and obey the speed limits, according to Maple Heights police.

Legal Clinic at Garfield Heights Civic Center Saturday to help low-income individuals with variety of legal issues

Judge Deborah Nicastro and Judge Sergio DiGeronimo of the Garfield Heights Municipal Court are sponsoring a Legal Clinic at the Garfield Heights Civic Center, 5407 Turney Rd., Garfield Heights, this Saturday, March 21, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Twenty attorneys will be available to advise low-income individuals about reinstating their driver's license, sealing misdemeanor records, divorce, and probate issues.

No reservations are needed; just walk-in between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m.; first-come, first-served. There are no documents required for participants to bring in.

Driving records can be accessed from your Social Security number and date of birth. Those wishing to reinstate their driver's license will then meet with an attorney who will explain the BMV reinstatement requirements and help them develop a reinstatement strategy.

Those convicted of a crime and have reformed their lives may be eligible to have their convictions sealed or expunged. An attorney will guide them through the process and develop a strategy for application to the correct courts.

Early Cleveland stories coming to Slavic Village Historical Society next week

Cleveland filmmaker and social media sleuth Allen Faulhaber is coming to Slavic Village next week to share the discoveries he's made about early 19th century Cleveland while roaming the city's hidden ruins.

The free public presentation will take place Thursday, March 26, at 7 p.m., at the Slavic Village Historical Society, 6804 Lansing Ave., across from Immaculate Heart of Mary Church. Questions from the audience and light refreshments will follow. On display at the museum will be original documents of the era selected from private collections.

Bedford Council okays purchase of vehicles for service, parks & rec depts.

Bedford City Council met on Monday, March 16, and passed several ordinances to purchase vehicles for municipal use from Valley Ford Truck, Inc., in Valley View.

Council authorized City Manager Mike Mallis to purchase:

- One 2026 Ford Explorer for the service department at a cost of \$41,703.38.
- Two 2026 Ford F250 4x4 pickup trucks for the service department at a total cost of \$118,691.16. These trucks will replace two 2004 pickup trucks which have outlived their usefulness.
- One 2026 Ford F250 4x4 pickup truck for the parks and recreation department at a cost of \$59,345.58. This truck will replace a 2002 pickup truck in use by the city.

Other legislation passed

A motion was passed to accept the planning commission's decision to deny Fernando Bigsy a zoning permit to open a group home at 58 Charles St.

A motion was passed to accept the planning commission's decision to grant Fermin P. Resurreccion, Jr. a zoning permit to open a food production/research facility at 225 Northfield Rd.

Also passed was an ordinance to make additional appropriations for current expenditures of the city during the year 2026.

A second reading was held to authorize the city manager to sign a 10-year contract with the city of Twinsburg for emergency dispatch services beginning in 2027. The third and final reading will be scheduled for a future council meeting.

Mayor's Report

In his report to council, Bedford Mayor Stan Koci announced that once again Bedford Finance Director Jennifer Howland and her staff had received the Ohio Auditor of State Award of Distinction for the year ending in 2024, which signifies the highest level of excellence in financial reporting.

Weapon Offense

On March 10, at about 11:11 p.m., officers on patrol eastbound on Granger Rd. observed an orange 2009 Kia SUV commit a marked lanes violation and then turned left onto E. 119 St., without using a turn signal. The driver did not have a valid driver's license. During the inventory search of the vehicle prior to tow, a loaded and chambered Bursa handgun was found in a holster under the front passenger seat. Neither the driver nor his male passenger initially admitted to possessing the firearm, and both were found to be disqualified from having weapons. After speaking with detectives, the driver admitted the handgun was his. Both men were booked for having weapon under disability. The report was forwarded to the Detective Bureau for follow-up and confirmation of charges.

Obstructing Official Business

On March 11, at 3:17 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Garfield Heights Library for a report that a group of about 20 people were fighting. They arrived and tried to break up a group of adult and juvenile females attempting to fight each other in the parking lot near the entrance. The majority of the group dispersed when police arrived, but an adult female continued to act belligerent and attempted to fight another adult female. The belligerent female was placed in handcuffs and began screaming that her car keys were lost and she believes someone stole them. She was secured in the rear of a cruiser and

continued to be uncooperative and would not identify herself, and continued screaming at officers about her missing car keys. She was placed under arrest and taken to city jail for booking where she continued to be uncooperative and refused to identify herself. She was placed in holding. Once she calmed down she provided the necessary information for the booking process. She gave a statement to police saying that the woman she was attempting to fight and her children had jumped her when she was picking up her daughter at the library and an altercation ensued. The woman in custody was charged with bond for obstruction and disorderly conduct. She was found to have two active warrants with Parma PD and Shaker Heights PD.

Shots Fired

On March 15, at 2:46 a.m., police were dispatched to Aries Restaurant Lounge, 4619 Warner Rd., in connection with a report that shots had been fired in the area. While officers were enroute, dispatch advised that the caller reported hearing two shots fired with a black male wearing a black jacket with glitter on the sleeves as the suspected shooter. A witness told dispatch that the suspected shooter appeared to flee the area in a black Lexus 4-door sedan with tinted windows heading north on Warner Rd., towards Cleveland. Officers touring the area saw several vehicles near Turney Rd. and Ella Ave. traveling recklessly at a high rate of speed and continued driving in that fashion north on E. 93 St. into Cleveland. A security guard at Aries was interviewed by officers, who told them a large group of individuals were seen arguing near Grand Division and Warner Rd., which is very near Aries. He said as the argument continued he heard two shots fired and the suspected shooter had fired in the air. Police were unable to locate any shell casings and no further calls came in regarding possible gunshot wound victims.

Koci pointed out that only 4% of cities in the State of Ohio receive this award on average.

City Manager's report

City Manager Mike Mallis, in his report, said that the city has applied to the county for two 2027 and 2028 grants that would provide matching dollars toward the reconstruction of Solon Rd., which is estimated to cost a total of \$24 million for the project.

He also noted that work has begun clearing a five-acre wooded lot the city owns on Willis St., near Taylor St. Mallis said, with future council approval, the site will be used to build a much larger salt storage facility there than the city currently utilizes.

Time is running out to challenge your property value

Dear Editor:

The bars along Warner Road between Grand Division and Garfield Boulevard in Garfield Heights are an ongoing nuisance in terms of noise, parking and litter. People screaming, yelling, revving & racing, parking -- these bars bookend a residential area. Imagine waking multiple times each night to the traffic and loudness. Screaming right outside of our windows.

Warner Road is no parking - see City Code Chapter 1155. These ordinances are clear - yet cars park everywhere they can fit in, including right in front of fire hydrants and driveways.

The litter created by the patrons, it's disgusting. My family is tired of cleaning it up. Again, let's look to the Code: litter is a violation. From the city's own website the Section 527.02 is highlighted:

"No person shall throw or deposit litter in or upon any street, sidewalk, or other public place within the city except in public receptacles, in authorized private receptacles for collection, or in official city dumps. Violation of this ordinance is a misdemeanor of the fourth degree."

Please, what can be done? It is not fair to the Police Dispatch that we keep calling. It's been YEARS this has been a problem. I do not want to do any more work than I have already; it's exhausting and I'm not gaining any ground. Every day these issues persist.

Property owners wishing to challenge their property valuations for tax year 2025 must file a formal complaint with the Cuyahoga County Board of Revision (BOR) by March 31, 2026.

All complaints must be received by the BOR by March 31, at 11:59 p.m. EST or bear a United States Postal Service postmark of March 31, 2026 or earlier. The BOR will reject all complaints bearing non-USPS postmarks received after March 31, 2026.

There are several ways to file a complaint:

- Filing online is free and easy, with no need for postage, parking fees or standing in line. Complaints can be filed online using a valid email address, which bypasses the requirement for a notary.
- Print a hard copy of the Complaint Form, which requires notarization. Contact the Board of Revision at 216-443-7195 to request a complaint form be mailed. Pick up a complaint form from the BOR office located at 2079 E. 9 St., second floor, Cleveland.

When filing a valuation complaint, property owners will need to provide an opinion of value and documents to support their claim, which can include, but is not limited to:

A complete appraisal report from the last calendar year

Dated photographs of the property showing current conditions

Certified repair estimates from a contractor

Purchase agreement with closing statement

New construction costs certified by a builder (hard and soft costs)

Property owners do not need to submit evidence at the time of filing the complaint. Evidence can be submitted up to seven business days before the scheduled hearing. Taxpayers can visit the BOR's website to find additional instructions for filing as well as examples of different types of evidence that can be submitted to support the opinion of value.

The BOR conducts hearings in-person, virtually and by phone.

The BOR's office is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. For more information, visit online, email BOR staff at BORinfo@cuyahogacounty.gov, or call 216-443-7195.

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What the Independence Schools Issue on the May 5 Primary ballot means

Voters in Independence will see a school funding issue on the May 5, 2026 Primary Election ballot that asks the community to approve a combined issue of two funding measures to support the construction of a new Pre-K-8 building.

If approved, the measure would allow Independence Local Schools to do two things:

1. Assess a 1% school district income tax on earned income.

This tax would apply only to income earned from work by residents who live in the Independence Local School District. It would begin Jan. 1, 2027 and remain in place for 30 years. The revenue would be used as debt repayment to construct a Pre-K-8 building. The tax does not apply to Social Security, pensions, retirement income, interest, investment income and other select incomes.

2. Issue bonds to construct a new Pre-K-8 building

and improve school facilities.

The district would borrow \$7.63 million through bonds to construct and equip a new school building for grades PreK through 8 and to renovate or improve other district facilities and sites.

To repay those bonds, the district would collect a 0.75 mill property tax, which equals about \$26 per year for every \$100,000 of a home's market value. This property tax would continue for up to 30 years while the bonds are being repaid.

What the project includes

The funding plan supports the district's proposal to build a new PreK through 8 school building on the district campus across from Independence High School. The new building would replace the district's current elementary and middle school buildings, which were built in 1956 and 1961.

District leaders say the combined earned income tax and bond issue approach spreads the cost across both residents' earned income and property values while helping fund a modern school facility for future students.

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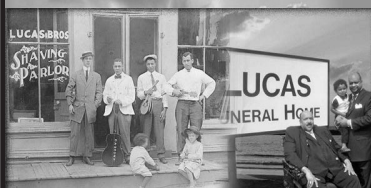
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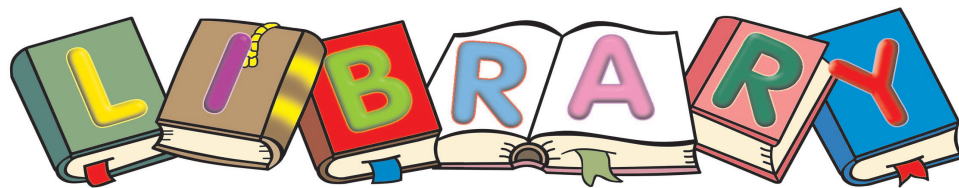
